THE AFRICAN AMERICAN BOARD LEADERSHIP INSTIUTUE (AABLI) HONORS UNION BANK and the RALPH M. PARSONS FOUNDATION LEADERS

LOS ANGELES – May 22, 2018 -- Union Bank, represented by Sylvia Castillo, director, foundation and community outreach officer, and Ralph M. Parsons Foundation, represented by Wendy Garen, president & CEO, were honored on May 16 by the African American Board Leadership Institute (AABLI) for their support of community leadership development. These organizations were presented AABLI's 2018 Vision Awards, held at the City Club in Los Angeles.

Virgil Roberts, AABLI's co-founder and board chair, stated, "AABLI's graduates make meaningful and significant contributions as members of governing boards, these visionary partners have made significant contributions to the community, particularly in opening the doors of opportunity to shape positive change in the boardrooms."
